Lastly but equally vital, guarantee effective representation for marginalized groups like the Roma throughout policy-making and execution stages. Foster meaningful dialogue engaging these communities by establishing collaborative networks with grassroots NGOs operating within Roma settlements.

In summary, true sustainable development can only be achieved when all members contribute fully and equally to shaping society's future. As Romania endeavors to address global challenges and meet SDGs by 2030, it is essential not to leave any community behind, including the Roma. By embracing these suggestions, Romania will display a sincere commitment to social inclusion, paving the way for a sustainable future for everyone.
